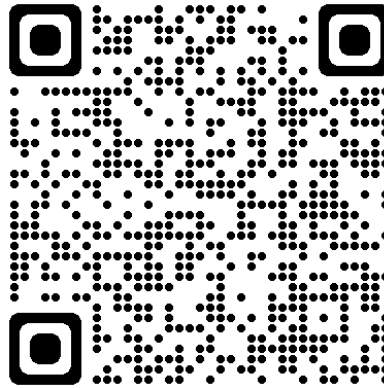

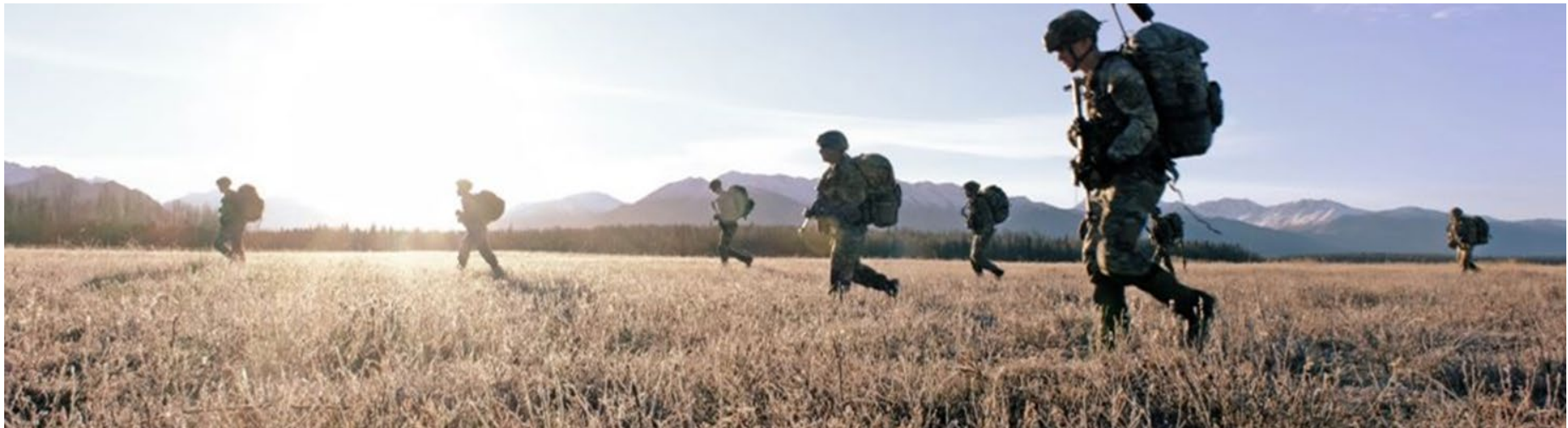

SAFEGUARD:

Suicide Avoidance Focused Enhanced Group Using Algorithm Risk Detection



Community Services Council Meeting 28 May 2025

- Develop **predictive** analytics models using existing data to identify Soldiers at highest risk for suicide.
- Design and deliver **targeted** trainings & interventions to Servicemembers at identified critical touch points to evaluate their efficacy in:
 - Preventing suicide and related harmful behaviors
 - Increasing mental toughness and resilience



- SAFEGUARD Team was tasked and funded by the previous Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs (ASD(HA)) for planning and executing research initiatives to achieve these goals.

Community Services Council Meeting 28 May 2025



- Developed an AI/ML predictive analytics model based on comprehensive Historical Administrative Data System of over 50 Army and DoD databases.
- Concerns: 95% of SAs occurred among soldiers who denied suicidality.
- Soldiers at the highest 25% predicted risk for suicide, as identified by the model, accounted for 70% of suicide attempts in the following 6 months, supporting use of the model to target preventive interventions.
- SAFEGUARD builds off this work, using health records and administrative data of DoD active duty Servicemembers to generate risk scores using the predictor variables determined by previous research.

- Life Skills
 - 4-week in-person and remote life skills training, periodic follow-up booster sessions, and a self-guided mobile app to prevent harmful behaviors.
 - Ft. Cavazos – launch at reception week for first duty of assignment soldiers.
- Life Force
 - 6-week remote skills training group that enhances the protective factor of mental toughness to mitigate suicidal desire and behaviors.
 - Ft. Cavazos – offered to Soldiers at highest predicted risk following Phantom Forge Center rotation or redeployment.
- Pathfinding
 - 6-month case management intervention to support soldiers following psychiatric hospitalization to prevent suicidal behaviors.
 - National recruiting – offer to soldiers at highest predicted risk following discharge from psychiatric inpatient hospitalization.



Community Services Council Meeting 28 May 2025

- Summary / Highlights
 - Interventions have already been proven to show reduction in suicidal behaviors in soldiers leaving service (ETS).
 - Anticipated timeline of project is mid 2025 - mid 2027.
 - All soldiers will receive interventions to strengthen life skills.
 - Some soldiers, including computer algorithm identified at-risk soldiers, will receive targeted non-medical interventions to reduce suicide risk.
 - Effective of the interventions to reduce suicidal behavior will be assessed over 12 months.
 - Potential to consolidate multiple existing resources for resiliency and to provide more efficient and less time-intensive interventions.

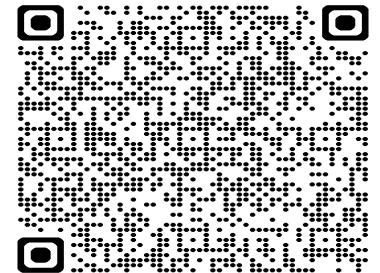

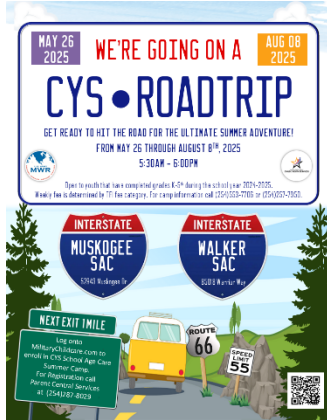

General Info – Transportation Office

- As soon as Soldiers get their orders, they need to come into the Transportation Office in the Copeland Center to start their PCS process. Orders must be in hand; no RFOs are accepted.

Peak Season Challenges and Mitigation Strategies

- Currently, HHG pick-up dates are being scheduled 16 days out, with deliveries extending into July.
To help us better serve you, please ensure shipment applications are submitted at least 30 days in advance of your requested pickup date. Counselors will contact customers if errors are present.
- Warehouse capacity remains good at this point; there are no saturated/blacked out warehouses.
Warehouse capacity is being monitored daily, and the team will seek guidance from the USTRANSCOM Storage Management team if capacity issues become an issue.
- During Peak Season, approximately 95% of household goods shipments will be managed through the Defense Personal Property System (DPS) vice the Global Household Goods Contract (GHC).
Based on a SECDEF memo (dated 20 May 25), DPS should be fully leveraged to cover GHC capacity shortfalls. Any non-serviced shipments from GHC will be re-booked through DPS, the legacy system.
- PPM close-outs currently have a small backlog. Application processing timelines and finalization timelines range from 5-7 days.
The team is regularly working overtime hours to address the backlog.
- Non-Temporary Storage Release (NTS-R) shipments have a small backlog. Application processing timelines range from 10-12 days.
The team is regularly working overtime hours to address the backlog.
- Special shipments (i.e. Bluebark, Safe Move) will be addressed on a case-by-case basis.
The team can process these shipments using the short-fuse option, which can include weekend services.


