



What motivated your interest in your chosen degree field, and how does it align with your personal goals and values? Additionally, explain why you believe this field is a better fit for you compared to other academic disciplines.





Application Window 24 December 2024 until 17 February 2025 Application Process

- 1.Application completed on website; online progress can be saved up to 30 days prior to submitting.
- 2.Two (2) letters of recommendation
- 3.Official Transcripts including GPA (HS Students 1st Semester)
- 4.750-word Essay
- 5. Sponsors orders or DD214
- 6. Military affiliation verified through Sheer ID

Award Process

- Blind scoring process completed by an outside selection committee
- Award amounts determined by the FCFSF Board based on Order of Merit List and available funds
- Awardees notified in late April; Awards Ceremony mid May.



Eligibility Requirements for ALL Scholarship Applicants

- Must possess a valid US military identification card and be enrolled in DEERS
- Cannot be a recipient of a full-tuition scholarship (to include tuition, room and board) or an appointment to a military service academy.
- Must submit a completed application no later than the deadline 16 February 2025. Incomplete and/or late applications will not be considered.

Applicant must be one of the following:

- The dependent child or spouse of an active duty U.S. military sponsor assigned to Fort Cavazos.
- The dependent child or spouse of an active duty U.S. military sponsor whose last duty assignment was Fort Cavazos and applicant resides in Bell, Coryell, Lampasas, McLennan, Travis or Williamson County while sponsor is on a noncommand sponsored assignment on orders.
- The dependent child or spouse of a retired U.S. military sponsor and both sponsor and applicant reside in Bell, Coryell, Lampasas, McLennan, Travis or Williamson County.
- The dependent child or spouse of a deceased member of the U.S. military forces and applicant resides in Bell, Coryell, Lampasas, McLennan, Travis or Williamson County.




