TOPIC 1: Bike safety – Specifically during ride to school hours 6:45 – 7:30 am

EXPLANATION/DISCUSSION: The neighborhoods are dark, and kids are riding to school with no lights or helmets. Concern for safety.

PROPOSED RECOMMENDATION: Helmet, Bike lights, reflective gear required on post. Possibly more lighting needed in neighborhoods. Publicity on the rules.

RESPONSE: FC Reg 190-5 (Fort Cavazos Traffic Code) requires that bicycles used between the hours of sunset to sunrise will be equipped with: A suitable headlight visible at 500 feet to the front, a red reflector on the rear visible at 300 feet, and an operable taillight.

< It is mandatory that all riders, including Family members, wear a bicycle helmet approved by the Consumer Product Safety Commission while riding on Fort Cavazos. When bicycling on roadways on DOD installations during hours of darkness or reduced visibility, bicycles will be equipped with operable headlights and taillights, and the bicyclist will wear a reflective upper outer garment. The DES will work with Garrison Safety and PAO to get this information out to the public and distribute this to the Community Life NCOs.

Winter is here, prepare your home for the coming weather.

Heating System

Test your heating system before the start of the winter season and report any concerns. It's normal for your home to smell after you switch on your furnace for the first time of the season. If the smell lingers for more than a few hours or a day, please call in a work order.

Filters

Change your HVAC filter monthly, and if you have pets, consider changing your filters twice at month.

Thermostat

According to Fort Cavazos Energy Regulation FH 420-9, the recommended temperature for Family Housing Quarters in the winter is between **65 & 70 degrees**. Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night. If you are away from your home for an extended period of time, **leave the heat on in your home and set to a temperature no lower than 55° F**.

Air vents and return grilles

Keep vents and return grills free of dust or debris. Avoid blocking air vents and return grills with pillows, furniture, plants, or pictures, etc.

Windows and Doors

Check around doors and windows for air leaks. If necessary, call maintenance to request a quick house inspection. Cover windows with heavier draperies or curtains.

Garage Doors

If your home has a garage door, make sure to **keep it closed during colder temperatures.** Keeping garage doors closed will prevent water supply lines and water heaters from freezing.

Ceiling Fans

If your home has ceiling fans, adjust the direction of your ceiling fans. Locate the fan switch that allows you to direct the blades to turn clockwise or counterclockwise. The right ceiling fan direction can help regulate the warmth of a room.

Smoke Detectors

Make sure to check the alarm by pressing the "test" button. If the alarm does not sound, it is probably broken, expired or needs new batteries.

Useful tips in case of Severe Winter Storm

Pets

Law requires pet owners to provide adequate shelter in case of extreme temperatures. Bring your pets inside during severe winter weather.

Let water drip

When the temperature falls below freezing, let cold-water drip from the kitchen or bathroom faucet. Running water through the pipes, even a trickle helps prevent pipes from freezing.

Hose bibs

With freezing temperatures, we recommend covering the outside faucets to prevent some damage to pipework and interior water leaks.

Trees & Shrubs

Winter storms can damage trees. Heavy ice and winds can cause limbs to break and fall. Walk around your home periodically to detect damaged trees and weak limbs. Call the community office or maintenance to report damage trees and limbs. Consider covering plants and shrubs to protect them during freeze warnings.

Space Electric Heaters

Space electric heaters can be an eco-friendly solution to warm up rooms faster.

- Never leave space heaters operating while unattended, or while you are sleeping.
- Before connecting your space heater, inspect the space heater, its cord and plug for damage, and follow all operation and maintenance instructions.
- DO NOT place it next to materials like curtains, beds, sofas, paper, clothing, and flammable liquids.
- DO NOT use a blowtorch, kerosene or propane heater, charcoal stove, or other open flame device inside or near the home.

Home Care Program

The Home Care Program helps monitor your home to reduce possible damage in your absence. Additionally, residents are required to notify the Community Center any time they leave their residence for more than two weeks.

- Upon notification, the home is regularly inspected according to the Home Care Program guidelines
- Whereabouts are kept private and confidential.
- While on Home Care, Cavalry Family Housing staff will monitor the home during your absence. Permission To Enter (PTE) allows authorized Cavalry Family Housing property management and maintenance staff to enter a home for the purpose of monitoring for emergency maintenance needs.

Requirement:

 Resident must sign up for the DES Home Watch Program to qualify for the Home Care Program. Residents can go to the MP Station to register.
