## Lesson **Investigation**: **Selfless Service** Lesson A1

#### Selfless Service

#### OBJECTIVES

#### Students will:

- · identify individuals who selflessly serve others
- · analyze the impact those people have on their communities
- · reflect on how they can embody the admirable qualities they recognize in others

#### Introductory Activity:

Hand out the worksheet to students. Ask them to complete the top part of the worksheet, writing a short paragraph describing individuals who they know who have dedicated themselves to serving others. Students should answer these questions in their paragraphs

- . Who is a person that you know who has dedicated himself/herself to serving others?
- . In what ways does this person serve others?
- . Why does this person stand out to you?
- . How do you think this person would want his/her service to be remembered?
- . What are some adjectives you would use to describe this person?

#### Small Group Activity:

Have students work in partner groups to discuss the people they wrote about. Encourage students to share only what they are comfortable discussing

#### Whole Group Activity:

Lead a group discussion by asking for voluntee

#### Concluding Activity:

Ask students to write a short reflection about he own service to others, and how they would like

# About the Medal of Honor

- The highest military award of the United States
- Given for "conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty..."
- Submitted by peer(s) who witnessed the action and validated by eyewitness accounts
- Awardees are referred to as "Recipients" rather than "winners"; it was not a competition





# About the Medal of Honor

- Signed into law in 1861 by President Lincoln
- 3526 total Recipients of the Medal of Honor
- 61 living Recipients of the Medal of Honor, who make up the Congressional Medal Of Honor Society





- Legacy program of the Medal of Honor Recipients who make up the Congressional Medal of Honor Society
- The lessons are centered on six core values: Courage, Sacrifice, Commitment, Integrity, Citizenship, and Patriotism
- Designed by educators for educators
- Easily integrated within current academic & counseling standards
- At no cost to educators or their districts

- Political







Donald A. Gary & Joseph T. O'Callahan: Medal of Honor Recipients for the Defense of the USS Franklin



Donald A. Gary and Joseph T. O'Callahan both come from what today could be considered large families: Gary was one of seven children and O'Callahan was one of six. Both men crossed paths during their Navy service on the USS Franklin and both ended their Navy corrers with the rank of Commander. But what really thes their stories together is how each one responded heroically on March 19, 1945, resulting in both men being awarded the Medal of Honor.


