Family Members and Retirees may obtain a flu shot at a TRICARE-authorized pharmacy or in network urgent care dinic. Beneficiaries are encouraged to check the policies and procedures of their preferred pharmacy prior to obtaining the vaccine. Some pharmacies require a prescription for children under seven years old and may not provide flu shots to children under 4. In such cases, parents can obtain a prescription from their primary care manager, visit a TRICARE network urgent care clinic, walk in to the CRDAMC pediatric clinic or attend any community or pediatric flu shot roundup.

What is REACH?

- A curriculum-based, weekly, support group for military spouses.
- Aims to improve spouses' quality of life, mental health, social support, and self-care practices.
- Provided in-person at Fort Cavazos, Texas.

How does it work?

- Eight sessions are facilitated by trained military spouse peer leaders.
- Includes discussion-based sessions, educational content, skillbuilding exercises, and activities.
- Randomly assigned to **ACTIVE** group or **WAITLIST**.
- Receive \$150 for completing 3 study surveys.







Benefits of Peer Support for Spouses

- Improves spouses' mental health and quality of life.
- Supports spouses finding connections with others= "social support"
- Better able to understand needs of their service member.
- Provides information and resources for themselves and their families.

How does it work?

- The participant must be married to or in a committed relationship with a service member serving at Fort Cavazos.
- The participant must have a reasonable expectation of remaining at Fort Cavazos for at least 4 months.
- Be willing to attend 8 sessions of a military spouse peer support group in person over 8 weeks.
- Fluency in English





Groups are forming now for JAN 2025

- Study is recruiting 75 more spouses to apply and participate in the study during 2024-25.
- Study enrollment ends in April 2025.



Winter is coming, prepare your home for the coming weather.

Heating System

Test your heating system before the start of the winter season and report any concerns. It's normal for your home to smell after you switch on your furnace for the first time of the season. If the smell lingers for more than a few hours or a day, please call in a work order.

Filters

Change your HVAC filter monthly, and if you have pets, consider changing your filters twice at month. Free filters are available at the Lawn and Garden or the Community Centers.

Thermostat

According to Fort Cavazos Energy Regulation FH 420-9, the recommended temperature for Family Housing Quarters in the winter is between 65 & 70 degrees. Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night. If you are away from your home for an extended period of time, leave the heat on in your home and set to a temperature no lower than 55° F.

Air vents and return grills

Keep vents and return grills free of dust or debris. Avoid blocking air vents and return grills with pillows, furniture, plants, or pictures, etc.

Windows and Doors

Check around doors and windows for air leaks. If necessary, call maintenance to request a quick house inspection. Cover windows with heavier draperies or curtains.

Garage Doors

If your home has a garage door, make sure to keep it closed during colder temperatures. Keeping garage doors closed will prevent water supply lines and water heaters from freezing.

Ceiling Fans

If your home has ceiling fans, adjust the direction of your ceiling fans. Locate the fan switch that allows you to direct the blades to turn clockwise or counterclockwise. The right ceiling fan direction can help regulate the warmth of a room.

Smoke Detectors

Make sure to check the alarm by pressing the "test" button. If the alarm does not sound, it is probably broken, expired or needs new batteries. Batteries are available at Lawn and Garden. Call a work order for inop smoke detector.







Useful tips in case of Severe Winter Storm

Pets

Law requires pet owners to provide adequate shelter in case of extreme temperatures. Bring your pets inside during severe winter weather.

Let water drip

When the temperature falls below freezing, let cold-water drip from the kitchen or bathroom faucet. Running water through the pipes, even a trickle helps prevent pipes from freezing.

Hose bibs

With freezing temperatures, we recommend covering the outside faucets to prevent some damage to pipework and interior water leaks.

Trees & Shrubs

Winter storms can damage trees. Heavy ice and winds can cause limbs to break and fall. Walk around your home periodically to detect damaged trees and weak limbs. Call the community office or maintenance to report damage trees and limbs. Consider covering plants and shrubs to protect them during freeze warnings.

Space Electric Heaters

Space electric heaters can be an eco-friendly solution to warm up rooms faster.

- Never leave space heaters operating while unattended, or while you are sleeping.
- Before connecting your space heater, inspect the space heater, its cord and plug for damage, and follow all operation and maintenance instructions.
- DO NOT place it next to materials like curtains, beds, sofas, paper, clothing, and flammable liquids.
- DO NOT use a blowtorch, kerosene or propane heater, charcoal stove, or other open flame device inside or near the home.

Home Care Program

The **Home Care Program** helps monitor your home to reduce possible damage in your absence. Additionally, residents are required to notify the Community Center any time they leave their residence for more than 14 days.

- Upon notification, the exterior of the home is regularly inspected according to the Home Care Program guidelines
- Whereabouts are kept private and confidential.
- While on Home Care, Cavalry Family Housing staff will monitor the exterior of the home during your absence. Permission To Enter (PTE) allows authorized Cavalry Family Housing property management and maintenance staff to enter a home for the purpose of monitoring for emergency maintenance needs.

Requirement:

Resident must sign up for the DES House Watch Program to qualify for the Home Care Program. Residents can go to the MP Station to register.

To sign up, please contact the Community Office.

6.16 Ornamental Lighting for Holidays

Residents are not allowed on roofs for any reason.

Reasonable use of inside and outside electric ornamental lighting is authorized. Do not penetrate roofs, siding or fascia with nails, staples, bolts, screws, etc. to install lighting. Use is restricted to dusk through dawn. Note the following:

- Residents may use clips or tape that is specifically designed to install temporary holiday lighting
- Residents will carefully inspect and control ornamental lighting to avoid fire
- Extension cords are intended for occasional use and shall not be used on a permanent or semi-permanent basis inside or outside of any Cavalry Family Housing home.
- Use of ornamental lighting is authorized as follows:
- Two weeks prior to and one week after all nationally recognized holidays

- Thirty days prior to and two weeks after the Christmas/New Year season
- · Residents will ensure that all self-installed lighting will be used in proper applications and meet safety regulations
- Outdoor lighting and electrical cords must be Underwriter Laboratory (UL) approved and designed for outdoor use
- Residents are responsible for any damage and/or liability resulting from the use of ornamental lighting
- Practice energy conservation and limit the use of ornamental lighting to the evening time. Do not leave lighting on during daylight hours.

Additional guidelines apply to historic homes. Please contact your community office for more information.

- Take full advantage of the DES House Watch Program when you go on vacation
 - Stop by the DES Police Desk to sign up (Bldg. 23020) (Call 288-1170 for more information)
- Do not advertise your vacation on social media prior to your vacation
- Avoid leaving packages on the front porch
- Do not leave gifts or packages in plain view inside vehicles
- Record serial numbers of all valuables (TV's computers, electronics)
- Ensure pets have access to shelter, food and water
- Lock your vehicles and do not leave wallets, purses, cell phones, etc. in car. Don't leave your keys in the car!
- Secure your home and lock all doors, especially before going to bed or leaving your home

Winter Driving

- Stock your vehicle with an emergency kit
- Reduce speed
- Increase following distances
- Do not drive impaired
- Keep your vehicle in good serviceable working order

Don't Drink and Drive!

- Have a plan, drink in moderation, have a designated driver, call a cab, Uber, Lyft, Unit Leadership, etc.

Cooking Safety

- If you leave the room, turn off the stove (Cooking is #1 leading cause of home fires each year)
- Pay attention to your cooking!
- Keep your stovetop clean to avoid grease buildup.
- Keep flammable items away from heat sources
 - Curtains, towels, potholders, clothing, etc.
- Oil and water don't mix! Never add water to a grease fire
- Turn off burner, cover pan with lid or cookie sheet to cut off oxygen
- Don't move the pan (hot grease can severely burn you)
- Leave your home and call 9-1-1

Candle Safety

- More than half of December home fires are started by candles
- Tips:
- Use flameless candles when possible
- Always blow out candles when you leave room or go to bed
- Keep candles out of children's reach
- Have candles on a solid base

Electrical Safety

- Don't overload outlets
- · Avoid putting cords across doorways
- Do not link more than three light strands, unless direction indicates it is safe

Christmas Tree Safety

- Each year in the United States there are an estimated:
 - 250 home fires involving Christmas trees
 - 170 home fires involving holiday lights and other decorative lighting
 - Make sure your tree gets plenty of water

If you have a fire...

- Leave, close the door, and call 9-1-1 from outside
- Report ALL fires to the fire department, even if you think you put them out!
- Don't ignore alarms!
- Even if your building has frequent alarms, you need to leave when they go off
- Once you're out, STAY OUT!
- Don't go back inside for possessions or pets
- Notify the fire department if anyone is unaccounted for
